SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

As I reflect on our 2014-15 school year, I'm struck by the range of emotions we all have likely experienced. There has been a great deal to celebrate and also events that have shaken our school district and community at-large.

Our community faced the tragic loss of two middle school students—a loss so profound for families, friends, classmates, and teachers that mere words cannot adequately express the impact. The closest I can begin to come is to say that it rocked us to our core and has forever changed our lives. We continue to build a deeper understanding of the complex emotions of our children by listening to what's in their hearts, empathizing with what it's like to be in their shoes, and providing guidance to help them navigate through the difficult periods of their lives. Our ultimate aim as human beings is to create connection by feeling seen, heard, and valued. May this fundamental need for connection continue to bring us together in hope and healing.

One significant positive for the district was the passage of the PPEL (Physical Plant and Equipment Levy). Tremendous support on the part of the community (80% approval) will allow

on the Iowa Tests. As a district, reading, math, and science scores were the highest we have experienced in the past 17 years in Urbandale and are a result of our work to transform the district to better meet the needs of students so that we may work toward our vision of "Bringing learning to life for everyone!" While it has taken five years of work to see these improved results, I believe we can say with certainty that our focus on systemic improvement "works!"

It is bittersweet for me to be retiring as superintendent of the Urbandale Community School District. The transformational work we have done in Urbandale and the results we are seeing have been the highlight of my 35 years in public education. I believe the district is positioned to "soar to new heights" with these improved results and I am a little sad not to be directly involved in that work any longer. He is a strong educator and leader, as well as a well-respected individual of high character. My best wishes to Steve and the entire district in "bringing learning to life for everyone!"

DISTRICT AWARDED TLC GRANT

On December 19, 2014, the Urbandale Community School District received an early holiday gift: Teacher Leadership and Compensation (TLC) funding was awarded to our district as the result of a competitive grant process involving districts from across the state. As a result of sustained and determined work of a dedicated group of UCSD teachers and administrators, we are proud to say that our plan received the seventh highest score out of 200 plans submitted by school districts throughout the state.

TLC funding is designed to provide additional leadership opportunities for career teachers. In Urbandale, there are three tiers of teacher leadership positions which have been created as a result of this funding. Beginning in 2015-2016, three Facilitators of Curriculum and Professional Learning, seven Instructional Coaches, and up to 60 Model Teachers will work to ensure the continued improvement of learning in all UCSD classrooms.

- Facilitators of Curriculum and Professional Learning will work as part of the Teaching and Learning department to provide leadership in curriculum, instruction, and assessment, as well as lead professional learning for teachers. The following UCSD staff will be transitioning to this new role in August: Michelle Cole, Steve Mefford, and Lindie Truitt.
- Instructional Coaches will work closely with UCSD building leadership teams to provide classroom teachers with high quality feedback regarding instruction and lead professional learning. The following UCSD staff will be transitioning to this new role in August: Olga Barnes, Angie Lorenz, Kori Maggart, Lance McConnell, Jill Miller, Katie Sevald, and Cynthia Wohlford.
- **Model Teachers** will serve as building leadership team members and will exemplify high quality instruction. These individuals will remain in the classroom as full time teachers, but will open their doors to colleagues to help improve instruction and assessment practices throughout the system.

The resources provided by the TLC funding will enable UCSD to expand our work in continual improvement and alignment of our system. Collectively the three tiers of teacher leaders, created as a result of the TLC funding, will make up the Urbandale Continuous Improvement Leadership Team (UCILT)—the UCSD district-level leadership team. At individual schools, these individuals will make up building leadership teams, which work to set school improvement goals, design and lead professional learning, and analyze data. Alignment of the work at district, building, and classroom levels will ensure each member of UCSD is working toward high-quality student learning goals with a keen focus on bringing learning to life for everyone.

Karen Acres Elementary

Students have been cutting down on food waste by placing unopened items served at breakfast and lunch into a bin that is then set out the following morning for students to take on their way to their classrooms. The items serve as healthy mid-morning snacks! Apples, bananas, cherry tomatoes, orange juice, milk and crackers are just a few of the items that have been redistributed.





Students in the fourth grade proposed a school-wide fundraiser to raise money to support polar bear conservation efforts. Students in the fourth grade class along with a few third graders worked during recesses and after school to sew stuffed polar bears and design pins to be sold to students at Karen Acres. Rolling Green Elementary

Rolling Green had 17 UHS students who provided 34 tutoring sessions per week for 45 minutes after the school day. Parents and students loved the academic gains and also enjoyed the practice with their older "study buddies."





Fourth-grade students were 100 % proficient in science with 45% in the advanced category of lowa Assessments. Fourth grade was also 93% proficient in math with 51% in the advanced category. Matched cohorts from fourth and fifth grades increased in advanced category by 30% in reading.

The Watch D.O.G.S. (Dads Of Great Students) Program at Rolling Green really took off this year! We often had one Watchdog per week. There is a bulletin board in the front hallway that has pictures of each Watchdog and their children as they worked at school that day.



Valerius Elementary



In April, Valerius staff and students were Flying Eagles! Teachers, Associates, Office Staff, and the Principal joined students in their quest for fitness and fun. We had a blast as we ran, jogged, and walked during lunch recess.



<u>Community Education:</u> As school winds down, Urbandale Community Education will continue to offer great programming throughout the summer. <u>Curriculum:</u> Work continues around identifying essential standards for student learning, and creating common definitions for student proficiency with respect to these standards. This work is the basis for Professional Learning Community work among teachers in and across buildings, as well as for creating high-quality assessments to measure students' progress toward mastering standards.

<u>Guidance:</u> In the wake of our tragic loss of two middle school students, the guidance program in conjunction with the at risk program and drop out prevention program is completing a comprehensive review of our suicide prevention programming with updates/improvements to be implemented for 2015-16 school year.

<u>Human Resources:</u> The UCSD HR Department is right in the middle of our busiest time of year. Managing the transitions and changes caused by retirements, resignations, reassignments, voluntary transfers, external job postings, screening, interviewing and hiring is critical to ensuring our students are supported by engaged staff. Over the past three years we have typically welcomed at least 50 new certified and classified staff members to start a new school year. So, we are also busy planning and scheduling onboarding and orientation activities for our future employees.

<u>Information Systems</u>: The Information Systems group has been meeting with teachers, administrators, and the Technology Steering Committee to determine what technologies to purchase and upgrade over the summer of 2015. Deploying the purchases we make as a result of the data we gather—as well as a variety of server and network projects—will keep us busy throughout the summer.

DEPARTMENT NEWS (QUICKVIEW CONT'D)

Maintenance & Construction: Building and Grounds is spooling up for another busy summer. Custodians will be team cleaning buildings; help to ensure their success by having as little clutter left in rooms and on walls as possible. Maintenance will be concentrating on preventative maintenance of all HVAC equipment—over 400 pieces of equipment throughout the district. It is also anticipated that construction will begin at Karen Acres Elementary this summer.

<u>Nutrition Services:</u> Nutrition Services has grown and done a lot of training during the 2014-2015 school year with three new management team members and 13 new general workers. We successfully served our regular meal to an average of 2400 students every day, 35 of those students being special diet plans, and served many, many ala carte items. We had eight employees complete the Serv-Safe Class. We are participating and doing studies in both the Balridge Program and Orange Belt.

Quality & Continual Improvement: During the second semester of the 2014-2015 school year, UCSD has continued to improve our processes and gather feedback to be used in our learning cycles. In January, UCSD hosted a Community Needs Assessment Forum designed to capture the voice of UCSD stakeholders. Parents, community members, representative from higher education, and workforce representatives from all departments of UCSD worked in small groups to provide feedback on various aspects of UCSD's work to improve learning for our students. This feedback is being used by the district School Improvement Advisory Committee (SIAC) to prioritize needs for the future and revise the district exit outcomes.

During the second semester, many UCSD teams of teachers and administrators have been called upon to provide learning opportunities for others outside our organization. Teams have presented our approach to teaching and learning at the Jim Shipley and Associates National Principal's Forum, the Iowa Recognition for Performance Excellence Celebration, the Heartland Superintendent's Network and a presentation and tour for Wells Fargo employees interested in understanding UCSD's approach to continual improvement. It is an honor to have our hard work recognized by those outside the district.

<u>Special Education:</u> The Special Education Program has just finished a new strategic plan aligned to the district's 2015-16 goals and is beginning the implementation of that work.

DEPARTMENT NEWS (QUICKVIEW CONT'D)

Student Services: March 1 is the open enrollment deadline each year. To date, we have approved 82 new applications for students to attend Urbandale Schools next fall. The ELL and At-risk departments have been reviewing services provided and their success to determine changes that may be made to better meet student needs and state guidelines for these programs in the coming year. The most extensive review took place with the ELP (Extended Learning Program, formerly TAG) department. They did a program review this year and had a new handbook approved at the board meeting last month. The ELP teachers and coordinator, Mrs. Taylor, completed comprehensive research and collaborated with students and parents to make changes to the program.

Teacher on Special Assignment: As Teacher on Special Assignment, I've been working with our literacy teachers K-12 and social studies teachers 6-12 on determining our essential standards from the core, defining what proficiency looks like for these standards, and how we will commonly assess for student learning. This work is intended to create a better understanding of what we are teaching and how we'll know if students have successfully learned the material. The next steps are to dig in and think about what to do if students don't understand the material yet, and what to do for students who already know the material. This process assists the alignment of the curriculum to instruction and assessment using the guiding questions of the Professional Learning Community process to drive our work.
