"Your journey has taught you collaboration, intentional instruction and strong relationships in school and with your community. You represent excellence—in vision, in implementation and in results—and we want to learn as much as we can from you."

Urbandale is celebrating an extraordinary achievement by one of its elementary schools. In September, Webster Elementary was designated a 2015 National Blue Ribbon School by the U.S. Department of Education. The national award uses standards of excellence evidenced by student achievement measures and research-based indicators of school quality to honor schools based on their overall academic excellence or their progress in closing the achievement gap. Since 2010, Urbandale has been embedding Quality & Continual Improvement practices throughout the District in order to create a systems approach for improvement that increases engagement, improves achievement, encourages collaboration and ignites a renewed passion for learning. This constancy of purpose is woven throughout every facet of the district which results in not only a common language for how the District will improve but clarity as to what's needed for improvement and most importantly, a profound understanding for why this improvement is critical for student achievement and success.

Continual improvement and personal growth are fundamental tenets at Webster Elementary and all Urbandale schools. Teachers work together as grade level teams in Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) to design and deliver instruction that benefits all students. Through careful lesson planning, teachers are encouraged to create lessons that are based on the characteristics of effective instruction. Teachers spend a significant amount of time using current assessment data to differentiate instruction to meet all student needs. Through this collaboration, a strong sense of commitment has developed to ensure that all students are successful in attaining key learning targets.

Instructionally, the Plan-Do-Study-Act (PDSA) process is utilized to make learning targets clear and assess student progress toward those goals. Each teacher has successfully used the PDSA cycle to involve students in the understanding of key learning targets being covered in class and the monitoring of their progress toward those key goals.

KAREN ACRES: CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Over the past five months, students and staff at Karen Acres Elementary have had the opportunity to see science, technology, engineering, art, and math brought to life to an even greater degree as their building is being transformed right before their eyes. Currently, 90% of the site work is completed. Electrical service to the building has been updated. Site utilities are in place and footings have been dug and poured. Concrete masonry unit walls in the main office area are up as well as precast concrete walls, bar joist and decking over the gym and office addition.

The second graders have been enjoying their newly renovated classrooms since occupying them on December 11, 2015. New carpet, countertops, increased square footage, and casework with improved shelving and cubbies for the students were part of the renovations. The

third graders transitioned to their new classrooms today, January 8, 2016. Both grade levels are grateful to be given the opportunity to finish their school year in their new spaces.


Throughout the spring, construction will continue in two additional existing classrooms with occupancy expected during the spring break timeframe. Work will continue on the additions and remodeling will start in the remaining areas during summer break.

Students, staff, and families have enjoyed watching the progress being made on the gym, within classrooms, and new office area—despite the inconveniences that come along with a large construction project. Patience and careful planning as each of the construction phases are completed will certainly be worth it come this summer as the project is currently scheduled for on-time completion in August 2016.






FACILITATORS OF CURRICULUM & PROFESSIONAL LEARNING

Overview

This fall, Urbandale had the opportunity to enhance leadership throughout the district by implementing the Teacher Leadership and Compensation (TLC) program. We have three Facilitators of Curriculum and Professional Learning, seven Instructional Coaches, and 42 Model Teachers collaborating to ensure the continued improvement of learning in all classrooms.

Facilitators of Curriculum and Professional Learning (FCPL) work as part of the Teaching and Learning department to provide leadership in curriculum, instruction, and assessment, as well as lead professional learning for teachers. Michelle Cole, Steve Mefford, and Lindie Truitt make up this highly talented team.

What's New

Our team of FCPL are working collaboratively with building and district administrators to define our Multi-Tier System of Supports (MTSS) system and instructional framework. This work provides clarity and focus on meeting the needs of all learners in our district. We are continuing the work of last year by meeting with department teams to clarify learning targets, align common assessments and resources, and continually improve instruction. Some examples of this work include, supporting UHS English and Social Studies departments as they implement new courses and materials aligned to the Iowa Core and UCSD Board-approved curriculum. Additionally, we have been working to support implementation of new units of instruction at the elementary level for newly aligned resources and assessments. Lastly, the state has approved the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) and teachers are in the process of unpacking the standards.

UHS ADMINISTRATORS RECEIVE AWARDS

Iowa State University selected Dania Wilson, Urbandale High School Assistant Principal, as the 2014 Jordan Larson Award recipient. As shared by Dr. Greg Robinson, the Jordan Larson Award is considered the MVP award for graduate students in the Educational Administration Program at Iowa State University.

"I was honored to win the Jordan Larson Award from ISU and I am also honored to be able to work in the Urbandale Community School District each and every day," said Dania Wilson. "Both my graduate work and my administrative profession have been shaped by the outstanding work of the teachers at UHS and the wonderful administrative team. I couldn't be luckier to have

The Jordan Larson Award is in memory of Dr. Jordan Lewis Larson, a long-time school administrator in Iowa, who served as the superintendent in Ames from 1935–1940, as well as superintendent in Dubuque in 1940. After moving on to the superintendency at Mt. Vernon, New York, Dr. Larson was elected to the Presidency of the American Association of School Administrators and served during 1954 and 1955. This award for excellence is supported by a foundation grant made by Superintendent Larson's daughter-in-law, Colleen Larson.

School Administrators of Iowa named Tim Carver, Associate Principal at Urbandale High School, the 2015-16 Iowa Assistant Principal of the Year.

Recipients are selected using the Iowa Standards for School Leaders, which focus on a vision of learning; the presence of a school culture and instructional program that is beneficial to student learning and staff professional development; a safe, efficient, and effective learning environment; work with parents and the community; fairness, integrity and ethics; and an understanding of the larger political, social, economic, legal, and cultural context in which we operate.

about as a result of our team's focus on learning and commitment to building positive relationships," said Tim Carver. "I also want say 'thank you' to SAI for their support of leaders in Urbandale and across the state in our work to continuously improve education. Carver has served as an administrator with the Urbandale Community School District since 2005. A committee of Iowa assistant principals selected Carver for the award. He will be recognized at a State Capitol ceremony in May 2016 and at SAI's Annual Conference in August. As Iowa's recipient, Carver is a candidate for the National Assistant Principal of the Year.

Garrison Hager, age 8, said that there's much more carpet space that is soft and clean. He added, "I'm excited to soon be getting our intercom installed!"




