ABOUT YOUR VISIT TODAY

THE LAST TRACTOR CART TO THE FARMS LEAVES
THE VISITOR CENTER AT 2:30 P.M.

WHERE DO WE START? From the Visitor Center, choose whether to walk into town or ride the tractor cart to the farms. You can start either direction.

WHAT WILL WE SEE? Our museum is composed of:

- Three working farm sites—the 1700 Ioway Farm, 1850 Pioneer Farm, and 1900 Horse-Powered Farm
- The Flynn Farm, Mansion, and Barn, listed on the National Historic Register
- The 1876 town of Walnut Hill

WHO WILL WE MEET? You will encounter historic interpreters in period dress at many sites—ask them questions! Your visit will be self-guided and self-paced.

HOW FAR WILL WE WALK? The walk through town is about ³/₄ mile. On the farm side, the tractor will drop you at the 1700 Farm. The walk from the 1700 Farm to the 1850 Farm is ¹/₁₀ mile of gravel trail. The walk from the 1850 Farm to the 1900 Farm is ³/₁₀ mile of woodland trail. If you would prefer not to walk from 1850 to 1900, return to the 1700 site and ask the tractor driver for a Step Saver Tour.

CAN WE WALK TO THE FARMS? There is no pedestrian access from town to the farms. For your safety, please stay on marked trails and use only designated areas for tractor cart pickups.

HOW LONG WILL OUR VISIT TAKE? Allow at least four hours to visit the town and all three farm sites.
